Dear Brother

By this I feel pleasure to say that your labors up till the present have been very satisfactory and your work have been noted with much satisfaction. Taking in consideration the condition of this Conference I feel to release you from your labors in den Haag about the eleventh of this month and to appoint you to labor in Utrecht, Elder King as presiding Elder.

Utrecht is a nice field of labor, so I think with faith, energy, and earnest efforts a good work can be done, so I hope and firmly believe you will work to gether with Elder King as you have done with the other Elders before and be a blessing to the church in heart in Utrecht.
